## INVITING THOSE WHO NEED HIM

A young couple, trying to live among the "in crowd", went to a stylish party. As a quintet played softly, someone identified the music as Mozart's. One said: *"Absolutely brilliant. Magnificent. Mozart was a genius."* The young woman wanted to join in and prove her place in this new crowd; she said: *"Ah, Mozart. You're so right. I love Mozart. Only this morning, I saw him getting on the No. 5 bus going out to Coney Island."*

A hush fell over the crowd and everyone snickered. Her husband was mortified. He pulled her out of the party quickly and they headed for home. On the drive home, she turned to her husband and said: *"You're angry at me, aren't you?"* He said: *"Oh, you've noticed. I've never been so embarrassed in my life. Everybody knows the No. 5 bus doesn't go out to Coney Island."*

One of the distinguishing marks of the New Testament church was their hospitality, their willingness to open their arms and their doors to anyone. In fact, Jesus commanded it; His parables tell about servants sent into the highways and hedges and about acts of kindness done to "the least of these." This was a unique characteristic of Methodism too. Mr. Wesley, a cultured Anglican priest, worked among the poor, stood before the mines and in the open fields to proclaim God's Word, and served the debtor, the sick, and the orphaned.
